

Anthony Brandt is an Associate Professor of Composition and Theory at Rice University's Shepherd School of Music. He is also Artistic Director of the contemporary music ensemble Musiqa, awarded Chamber Music America and ASCAP's 2013 Adventurous Programming Award. His compositional honors include a Koussevitzky Commission from the Library of Congress, fellowships to Tanglewood, the MacDowell and Djerassi Arts Colonies and grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, Meet-the-Composer and the Houston Arts Alliance. Dr. Brandt has organized two international conferences on "Exploring the Mind through Music" at the Shepherd School, co-authored a paper on music and early language acquisition in the journal *Frontiers*, and is currently a co-investigator in a neuro-imaging study at Houston Methodist's Center for Performing Arts Medicine. He has created a free, web-based music appreciation course titled "Sound Reasoning," supported in part by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. Dr. Brandt has been awarded Rice University's Phi Beta Kappa and George R. Brown Teaching Awards.
